

During the past year the Board of Education has been very busy with a number of things. The county board of education and the county superintendent suggested that the Carlisie District should consolidate with Allen Township in Polk County, Union and Scotch Ridge in Warren County to make a larger and more economical district. The committee for this work included Mr. Randleman, Mr. Ben Miller, and Mr. Wenberg.

When the election was held and the reorganization carried, the Carlisle board had to resign to make room for the new board to represent the whole district. The three members of the Carlisle board who did not run for the new board were Frank Arnold, Ben Miller, and John Smith.

During this year Henry Owens completed 46 years as the secretary for the school board. On his retirement the board had a little party to celebrate this long tenure of service.

The rest of the year will be busy for the new board in planning how and what expansion will be needed to take care of the enlarged enrollment of pupils in the district.
