





We feel that the school is happy to have such a fine group of Sophomores, among them many standouts in the fields of vocal, band, and athletics.





Wildcats Sprint to Track Victories

When Coach Robert Spencer came to C. H. S. in 1957 he was ready to revolutionize the track program. In 1958 he was lucky to get 10 boys out, but now he coaches a squad of 77 boys, all utilizing the school's best possible program of physical fitness. The Administration has provided good facilities for what could become one of the best track layouts in the state of Iowa.

Before Coach Spencer came to us, (which, incidentally is still his first teaching and coaching job) he was an outstanding high school trackman and a Freshman letterman in track at Parsons College where he threw the javelin and ran the 440 yard dash. In the service he worked as an athletic non-commissioned officer where he coached football, basketball, softball, volleyball, and track.

When he first began to take the boys to meets, the name of our school was seldom pronounced correctly. Today, by competing well against many larger schools including Suburban opponents Johnston, Urbandale, Ankeny, and Saydel, we are ranked among the top Class B schools in the state. C. H. S. has won the district title for the past three years and placed third in the state

outdoor in both 1961 and 1962. This year we have been second only to Ankeny in both the Suburban Conference Indoor and Outdoor.

The Wildcat Relays, which were started in 1958 by Coach Spencer, had its sixth annual running this Spring. C.H.S. took 3rd in the Varsity Division and 4th in Jr. -Varsity Division and set a new meet record in the mile relay in the Varsity Division. This year the event drew 34 schools and over 600 athletes, both boys and girls. Last year C.H.S. won both divisions.

Many relays have been added to the schedule recently to prepare us for keener competition in our own class. They are: Drake Relays, Perry Relays, Ankeny Relays, Valley Relays, and S. C. I. Relays.

In closing, Coach Spencer says that he looks forward to the new stadium and track in hopes that C.H.S. may soon have the facilities to accommodate the Suburban Conference, District, and even State meets. He asks us to keep in mind that . . "A coach in only as good as the people he has to work with, both students and other coaches."






The Windy City




